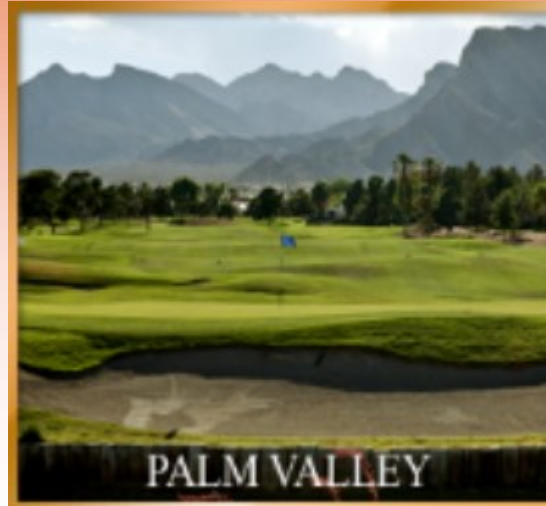

**William H. "Bob" Bailey**, traveled to Las Vegas to in 1955 to be a part of the opening show for the Moulin Rouge, the first racially integrated hotel-casino in Las Vegas. Not long after that, Bailey and his wife Anna decided to settle in Las Vegas.

A Las Vegas businessman and civil rights activist was known as the first African-American television personality, having landed roles from the 1950s to the 1970s on local stations as a variety show host, director, producer and newscaster.

Bailey was active in the civil rights movement and is credited with helping establish equal rights for African-Americans and other minorities. He worked with former Nevada Gov. Grant Sawyer to investigate discrimination in employment, and was appointed by Sawyer as the first chairman of the state Equal Rights Commission. He helped to desegregate hotel-casinos under the Nevada Civil Rights Act of 1965.

Bailey business ventures included the Sugar Hill Lounge and Liquor and the Golden West Shopping Center, both in West Las Vegas. He also helped establish the Nevada Economic Development Corp., which helped minority business owners obtain more than \$300 million in funding. President George W. Bush appointed Bailey to serve as deputy director of the Minority Development Business Agency.

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**Reverend Dr. Marion D. Bennett Sr.**, a hero who came to Clark County in 1960 at the height of the civil rights movement, Bennett worked with another reverend, Dr. Martin Luther King, to push a message of nonviolence. After graduating from Sterling, he attended Morris Brown College in Atlanta, where he received his bachelor of arts degree and, thereafter, he attended Interdenominational Theological Center, where he received a masters of divinity degree. He also received a doctorate of divinity degree from Technical Institute of Biblical Studies. Reverend Bennett came to Zion United Methodist Church in Las Vegas, July 2, 1960, and continued to serve until 2003. The pastor at Zion United Methodist Church for more than 50 years.

In 2004, he was the founder of Zion Independent Methodist Church. He founded and operated Nevada's oldest and lowest cost African-American day care facility. Reverend Bennett served three terms as branch president of the NAACP, member of the Economic Opportunity Board for 20 years and chairman of the Nevada Economic Development Company. He also served in the Nevada State Legislature from 1973 to 1983.
